ECR Implementation (What's Next?)



- 2014 Priorities
 - USML: All revised in effect, published, or under interagency review
 - 14 of 21 USML Categories revised and in effect by end of 2014
 - Definitions: Review/revision under way
 - 120.9 Defense Services
 - 120.10 Technical Data
 - 120.11 Public Domain



UK/Australia DTCT Implementation



- UK (ITAR Part 126.17)
 - 24 members of UK Approved Community with 23 more underway
 - US AC (all U.S. registered and eligible companies)
 - 44 exports to date
 - 37 for military/counter-terror ops and exercises
 - 7 for HMG end-use
- Australia (ITAR Part 126.16)
 - 14 members of Australia AC with 13 more underway
 - 1 export to date



UK/Australia DTCT Next Steps



- Exempted Technologies List (ETL)
 - ETL will narrow as USML is revised due to ECR
 - U.S. committed to ETL review after completion of ECR rule changes to USML (end of 2014)
 - U.S. DoD cross-checking Treaties ETL as items move from USML to CCL
- Promoting Treaty Exemption Use
 - ECR will NOT negate value of Treaties many continued benefits unique to Treaties
 - (e.g., facilitation of exchanges of technical data)
 - Programs involving exempted technologies can still use
 Treaties (but may require license for those specific items)



ITAR "Canadian Exemptions"



- International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR)
 Part 126.5
 - Permanent/temporary export and temporary import of certain unclassified defense articles for:
 - "End-use in Canada by Canadian Federal or Provincial governmental authorities acting in an official capacity or..."
 - "Canadian registered person or..."
 - "[R]eturn to the United States."
 - Key Limitations:
 - Defense articles, services, tech data in paragraphs 126.5 (b)(1) –
 (b)(21)
 - No third country transit
 - Exempted technologies for 126.5, 126.16, 126.17 compared in ITAR Part 126 "Supplement No. 1"



Conclusion



- U.S. export controls in era of transition
 - Enumerated controls = continuous change (i.e., ECR is the New Normal)
