“ The conference was useful in the combined format. However, I noticed that most people only attended the day(s) that represented their core area. ”

“ Some of the information shared with industry was useful but most ... was relayed during the Spring APBI”

Other Items or Concerns

“ Continued delays in the release of the JECF solicitation call into question both the Government’s commitment to the program and Industry’s decision to commit funds for B&P efforts. ”
