Speaker Biography

Col Anne Weinberg, USMC
*Chief, Operations Division,
ISR-TF, USD(1)*

Colonel Anne Weinberg pinned on Colonel in April 2010, and is currently assigned as the Operations Division Chief of the Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Task Force, Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence.

Colonel Weinberg was born in Carmel, California, grew up in Vancouver, Washington and is a 1989 graduate of Leland Stanford, Jr. University in Palo Alto, CA. Colonel Weinberg holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Human Biology from Stanford University, and Associate of Arts Degrees in both Korean and Japanese from the Defense Language Institute, Foreign Language Center, Monterey, CA.

From 1991-1992, Colonel Weinberg served as a Platoon Commander and Intelligence Analyst in the 1st Surveillance, Reconnaissance, and Intelligence Group, Camp Pendleton, California. During this period she served in key intelligence and liaison billets in support of Operations Restore Hope and Continue Hope in the Horn of Africa.

Following language training at the Defense Language Institute in Korean, she served as an East Asian Foreign Area Officer in Seoul, Korea. She then served as an intelligence analyst in the Estimates Branch, J2, U.S. Forces, Korea.

From August 1998 until July 2001, Colonel Weinberg served as the Team Chief for North Korean Military Affairs at the Defense Intelligence Agency, Washington, DC. After that tour, she was the Intelligence Liaison Officer for Headquarters, Marine Corps Intelligence Department and Naval Intelligence at the Pentagon.

In 2003, she moved back to California to serve as the Intelligence Officer for MAG-11, an FA-18 Air Group in Miramar, California. During this tour, she served as the Senior Watch Officer for the Tactical Fusion Center in Ramadi, Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. From 2004 until 2007, she filled the Operations Officer billet for the G2, 1st Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Pendleton, CA.

Upon graduation from Japanese language school in 2008, Colonel Weinberg attended Top Level School at the National Institute for Defense Studies in Tokyo, Japan. Colonel Weinberg was then assigned as the Operations Officer, Intelligence Department, Headquarters, Marine Corps, Washington, DC.

Colonel Weinberg's decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal w/OLC, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal w/OLC, and Joint Service Achievement Medal.

Colonel Weinberg lives in Burke, Virginia with her two sons David and Christopher.
