# Health of Sector

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- Mature sector and can be called up for execution
- Beyond current mission, nothing much beyond in the chem-demil/non-stockpile mission
- PCAPP operations continue; biosystem working well
- BGCAPP systemization and operation;
  - Redesign of Static Detonation Chamber (SDS) for nerve agent
  - SDS Mustard operational
- Prepared for international CWE contingencies
- Risk of loss of expertise and knowledge base
- Leverageable expertise to tangential industry sector

# Major Sector Concerns

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- Vision for Industry:
  - Beyond Pueblo (PCAPP) and Blue Grass (BGCAPP), the Sector does not anticipate much beyond.
  - Major concern is risk of losing sector expertise and knowledge base
  - Future global contingency operations may retain some operational capabilities but not beyond.
- Investment:
  - Investment to maintain knowledge base
  - Strategic opportunities to apply capabilities in tangential sectors

# Sector Expectations for CBDAIF Meeting Outcomes for Next Year

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- Address uncertainty with risk of losing the knowledge base
- Sector capability application in tangential sectors such as (a) contingency CWE; (b) chemical security; and (c) NTA R&D
- P3 initiatives in R&D on mobile, deployable CWE and NTA
- Support sector expertise and knowledge-base retention

# Other Sector Issues

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- Future global contingency operations will be lead by the US, which faces the risk in the Sector of losing the workforce.
- Sector expertise and knowledge base disspation with completion of ongoing projects (Pueblo and Blue Grass).
- Sector capability could be leveraged by other JPMs.
