#### **DAMIR**

- Streamlines program management by eliminating burdensome reporting
- Allows OSD to perform its oversight role and respond to OMB and Congress
- Leverages existing data sources
- Reduces non-value added workload up and down the chain
- Enables two-way information flow
- Allows OSD to "pull" data as needed from official sources
- Will replace current legacy CARS



#### **DAMIR Earned Value Pilot**

- EV selected for prototype because
  - Data is known to be available
  - Timeliness of EV data is an issue
- EV data pull from Service/program office
- Consists of presentation layer, web services data "pull" software, and change management
- Will operate on the unclassified network with access via the web
- Army pilot in progress
- Replaces legacy EV CARS field data input
- Implementation expected in September 2004



#### **WBS** Handbook

- MIL-HNBK 881 last published January 1998
- Update needed to:
  - Incorporate changes to DoD acquisition policy
  - Add/improve upon definitions of WBS for space, ships, and aircraft (especially UAVs)
  - Clarify application for systems of systems/family of systems
  - Update software definitions; add risk analysis for cost/engineering tradeoffs
- Working with OSD CAIG to ensure product meets needs of both program management and cost estimating communities
- AT&L in process of awarding contract (6-month effort expected to begin in June 2004)
- User friendly, web accessible final product



#### **EVM Web Sites**

OSD EVM web site

- Noteboard transferred to ACC in January 2004
- Additional updates/improvements to OSD site coming soon
- OSD site to continue with links to other electronic sources (DCMA, PMI, etc.)
- AT&L Acquisition Community Connection (ACC) on DAU web site

(http://acc.dau.mil/evm)

- EVM now "Special Interest Area"
- Discussion forum up and running
- Next step elevate to "Community of Practice"



#### **IPMC**

- Ten-year MOU signed by Australia, Canada, and the United States in 1995
- Bi-lateral agreement enabled United Kingdom to subsequently join (Japan and Sweden also interested)
- Comprehensive framework of international collaboration on project management
- > IPMC activity reinvigorated at Fall conference
- Australia is current chair
- IPMC meets at least annually to exchange information and share best practices
- MOU expires in November 2005 OSD working to extend agreement for another 10 years

# **Current EVM Policy**

- DoD Directive 5000.1, The Defense Acquisition System, May 12, 2003 – EVM is not addressed
- DoD Instruction 5000.2, Operation of the Defense Acquisition System, May 12, 2003 EVM is a Regulatory Information Requirement (Table E3.T2)
  - Implement EVM guidelines in ANSI/EIA-748 on contracts/agreements over designated dollar thresholds (RDT&E – over \$73M, Procurement – over \$315M)
  - Conduct Integrated Baseline Reviews (IBRs)



## **Current EVM Guidance**

- DoD Regulation 5000.2-R, Mandatory Procedures for MDAPs and MAIS Acquisition Programs, April 5, 2002
  - Canceled as a "regulation" remains in effect as an "interim guidebook" (dated October 30, 2002) until replaced
  - Not mandatory, but should be used for best practices, lessons learned, and expectations
- Defense Acquisition Guidebook
  - Under development—EVM Chapter 12
  - Updating/revising EVM contents
  - DFARS also being updated
  - Electronic publication expected Summer 2004
- Program Managers' Guide to the Integrated Baseline Review Process



### Proposed Changes to Policy/Guidance

#### EVM Reporting Requirement

- Eliminate C/SSR
- Update CPR DID
- Develop guidance for tailoring CPR
- Update IMS DID and transfer ownership from Air Force to OSD
- Develop guidance for tailoring IMS

#### EVM Management Requirement

- Eliminate C/SSR and CPR-No Criteria as categories
- Allow ANSI Compliance-No Validation on contracts below new upper threshold



### Proposed Changes to Policy/Guidance

#### EVM Implementation

 Work out details on what ANSI Compliance-No Validation means

#### **EVM Application**

- Establish new dollar thresholds (no differentiation between RDT&E and Procurement)
- Allow EVM on FFP contracts (risk-based decision for program manager)

#### Integrated Baseline Reviews

- Require when EVM is required
- Consider need for common DoD IBR Handbook



# **Proposed Threshold Changes**

- Lower ANSI compliance threshold to \$20M (from \$73M and \$315M)
- Lower EVM System validation threshold to \$50M (from \$73M and \$315M)
- Raise threshold for EVM requirement to \$20M (from \$6.3M)
- Require Integrated Master Schedule at \$20M
- Require Integrated Baseline Reviews at \$20M



# **Summary of Proposed Changes**

- Whenever EVM is required (contracts above \$20M):
  - Compliance with EVM guidelines (C/SSR eliminated)
  - Contract Performance Report
  - Integrated Master Schedule
  - Surveillance
  - Integrated Baseline Review
- EVM System validation required on contracts above \$50M
- EVM on FFP contracts is risk-based decision



#### Follow-On Actions

- Finish business case on potential cost impacts of policy changes
- Develop tailoring guidance
  - CPR place in EVMIG
  - IMS place in IMP/IMS Guide
- Define what ANSI Compliance—No Validation means place in EVMIG
- Update EVMIG
  - Remove EVM guidelines
  - Insert tailoring guidance, how to contract for EVM
- Develop common DoD IBR Handbook?

- Release policy paper and updated DIDs for government and industry comment
  - NDIA PMSC meeting (April 2004)
  - PMI-CPM conference (May 2004)
- Comments due by June 14, 2004
  - Government through respective DoD Working Group representative
  - Industry through NDIA PMSC
- Joint Government/Industry Working Group meeting July 13-14, 2004, at DAU (Fort Belvoir)
  - Disposition comments on policy changes
  - Develop plan to address issues/concerns

Status update to DAEC (July/August 2004)

- After approval of policy changes
  - Update DoD 5000.2 (issue interim policy if necessary)
  - Update Defense Acquisition Guidebook
  - Update DFARS clauses



- Joint Government/Industry Working Group to meet in July 2004 – in response to DAEC tasking



# CURRENT DoD Policy for EVM Application

DoDI 5000.2, Table E3.T2, Regulatory Information Requirements

- Major Contracts
  - Development contracts >\$73M (BY00)
  - Production or O&M contracts >\$315M (BY00)
  - ANSI/EIA-748 guidelines
  - May be applied to any type of contract
    - Should not apply on T&M

Formal Acceptance of Contractor's EVM System

Cost
Performance
Report

- Less than Major Contracts
  - Recommended (not policy)
  - Greater than 12 months
  - Greater than \$6.3M (BY00), but less than thresholds for major contracts

# DRAFT NEW DoD Policy for EVM Application

- Major Contracts
  - Any cost or incentive contract >\$50M
  - May be applied to any type of contract
    - Should not apply on T&M
    - FFP contracts risk-based decision
  - ANSI/EIA-748 guidelines

Formal Acceptance

Contractor's EVM System

#### **CONTRACT**

Performance Report

- Less than Major Contracts
  - Greater than 12 months
  - Greater than \$20M, but less than threshold for major contracts
    - Below \$20M risk-based decision
  - ANSI/EIA-748 guidelines
