Objectives:




- 1. Modify PMSC charter and objectives to reflect broader focus.

- Initiate a campaign to increase program manager participation in PMSC.



Objective #3: Increase PM Participation in PMSC

- On average, Program Management is primary focus of 22% of attendees
 - Participation has leveled off
 - Way Ahead includes focus on Communications Plan

Accomplishments – since last meeting

- Developed a "standard" briefing package
 - Awaiting Board approval
- Identified two PM presentations for the May meeting
- Recommended two presentations for August meeting
- Compiled list of trade shows to possibly "advertise" PMSC
- Investigated a LinkedIn presence for PMSC
 - Planning to pilot a LinkedIn presence but need a paper that discusses the objectives and how to measure whether it should go beyond the pilot stage



PM Topics Recommended for August 2011

- Probability of Program Success Ken Spiro, OSD
 - The probability of program success initiative is designed to improve DoD's ability to accurately assess a program's probability of success, and clearly / concisely represent that success probability to leadership.
 - Standardized tool to assess program health via pre-specified checkpoints before each milestone and key program events
 - Standard method of representing the health of all ACAT Programs
 - Program reviews and briefs in PoPS format
- The role of the Project Management Office on Information Technology project success – Stan Emelander, Program Manager, PM Individual Weapons, US Army
 - Problem: Too many IT projects are not completed on schedule, on budget, and within scope, resulting in cost overruns, and missed business opportunities.
 - Objective: This study investigated whether the presence of a PMO or PMO functions in an organization improves the rate of success for IT projects.
