DCMA Intention

- If adequate OE does not exist to substantiate the approved status, then...
 - If site has contract with DFARS requirement, then Approved status will be maintained in CBAR and DCMA will take appropriate action (described next chart)
 - If site does not have contract with DFARs requirement, the site EVM system status will be changed to N/A





Appropriate Action Approved Status w/o Paperwork

- No Change to CBAR w/o data being presented to the DCMA BoR
 - If there is data (previous reviews, open CARs, etc) indicating issues, then the rating may be adjusted.
 - If no there is no evidence either way, EVMID would be asked to perform a CR.
- Either way the rating is based on objective evidence

 Goal is integrity of information in CBAR tool being reported up through ATL AFET nisa PS
