SUBJECT: Updated Implementation of Cost Data Reporting Requirements in Accordance with Section 2334(g)

References: (a) Implementation of Data Reporting Requirements for Acquisition Programs in Accordance with the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2017, February 16, 2018

> (b) Implementation of Cost Data Reporting Requirements for Middle Tier Acquisition Programs, August 30, 2018

Section 842 of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2017, Public Law 114-328, amended section 2334 of title 10, United States Code (section 2334), to require the Director of Cost Assessment and Program Evaluation (CAPE), in consultation with the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition and Sustainment, develop policies, procedures, guidance, and a collection method to ensure quality acquisition cost data is collected to facilitate cost estimation and comparison across acquisition programs. In accordance with section 2334(g), this memorandum updates existing cost data reporting policies and in doing so supersedes Reference (a).

Cost and Software Data Reporting (CSDR), consistent with the requirements of DoDI 5000.02, Table 7 of Enclosure 1, is now required for ACAT II programs. Cost reporting plan approval for ACAT II programs is delegated to the MILDEP Cost Center Director or the Component equivalent. Consistent with statute, the waiver of cost reporting requirements on required programs may only be granted by the CAPE Deputy Director, Cost Assessment.

In accordance with military department requests, CSDR requirements are waived for specific ACAT II programs as shown in Attachment A. Also, CSDR requirements are waived for all ACAT II contracts with a planned final Request for Proposal (RFP) release prior to March 1, 2019. As is the case for all CSDR requirements, tailoring will be considered on a case-by-case basis by the relevant approval authority to ensure the Department receives meaningful insight into actual costs that is useful for preparation of cost forecasts, while minimizing the burdens associated with cost reporting.

r ACAT III and IV programs not identified as pilots in Reference (a), the current cost data collection requirements is extended indefinitely. The data submissions for t programs will be used to reassess this waiver and, if appropriate, be used to inform a proposal to adjust the statutory cost reporting requirement criteria.

DR requirements for ACAT I programs remain unchanged from DoDI 5000.02 and nts for Middle Tier Acquisition programs remain unchanged from Reference (b). The esholds and approval authorities for CSDR reporting are summarized in nt B.

- New CAPE memo from 4 January 2019 updates the CAPE memo of 16 Feb 2018.
 - CAPE has now imposed CSDR requirements on <u>all ACAT II</u> programs GT \$50M and <u>discretionary</u> for \$20M-\$50M.
 - · This new requirement will not be retroactive
 - Will be imposed on <u>final RFPs released after March 1 2019</u>.
 - The CAPE DDCA can waive this requirement.
 - Tailoring will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
 - The current waiver for data collection requirements for ACAT III and IV's is extended indefinitely.

Introduction:

The Service Cost Agencies, with cooperation from OSD CAPE and various Govt Engineering Communities, have produced a draft list of core technical parameters that eventually may find their way into a CDRL on one of your future contracts. We have previously briefed the topic at the CSDR Focus Group events and various events such as the Aviation CIPT, Space CIPT, etc. As discussed in those venues, we wanted to give you an opportunity to review and comment on the attached core technical parameters listing by commodity area. The resultant core parameter list represents the government's starting point for the Technical Data Reporting that may be required in a Request for Proposal (RFP). One goal is for some level of standardization however we recognize each contract will have unique elements. Your participation is voluntary and we appreciate any constructive feedback.

Technical Data Report

Core Parameter Introduction

The magnitude of data sought varies by length and depth of the WBS

Common parameters for hardware WBS elements

Size, Weight, and Power (SWAP)

- > Volume (Cubic Feet)
- > Weight (Pounds)
- Max Power Consumed (Watts)

Heritage

- > Percent New Design
- Predecessor System

Unique parameters for hardware WBS elements

Varies by Item Type, Examples:

- > Antenna: Aperture, Effective Radiated Power, etc.
- > Engine: Inlet Temperature, TSFC, etc.
- > Wing: Area, Wingspan, Number of Movable Surfaces, etc.

Unique parameters by Commodity Type

Varies by Commodity. Examples:

- > Spacecraft: Orbit Regime, Mission Duration, Pointing Accuracy, etc.
- > Aircraft: Combat Radius, Max Speed, Max Useful Load, etc.
- Missile: Speed, Max Effective Range, Burnout Weight, etc.

Phone call with CADE; 31Jan 2019

- Dr. Burke will be signing a new policy memo in the next two weeks
 - Starting about April, new RFPs will be mandated to start using the FlexFile and 1921-Q DIDs
 - There will be exceptions on a case by case basis
 - o 1921-Q won't be required in all cases like the 1921-2
 - New policy will not be retroactive on existing contracts or contract Mods
 - No changes to the current FlexFile DID (Nov 2017)
 - Will not require the 12 additional fields
 - They will not be requiring the FlexFile to be submitted in the JSON format – Excel or CVS are OK
 - DCARC will convert to JSON format
 - They expect to go back and forth scrubbing a companies Excel or CVS formats
 - No standard Excel or CVS formats
 - They will be changing the Verification testing for the FlexFile
 - Same rigor but more focus on compliance with the DID
 - CADE will be revising the DD 2794 Form no longer a Co-Plan





Discussions from Working Group 6 Feb 2019

- The IPMD Working Group wants to stay engaged and be the conduit with CADE regarding the new proposed DIDs 1921-T, -M/R and CBOM also under consideration.
- Discussed that the new ACAT II memo is a policy statement, but CSDR plans may not have been identified
 - Services will be signing the plan now for ACAT II. Maybe these will only require 1921 and not the others: 1921-1, -2, etc.
 - Mid Tier Acquisitions (Section 804/OTAs) thresholds included in the 4-Jan-19 memo
- Discussed that CAPE has documented their Rapid Prototyping/Rapid Fielding (Mid Tier Acquisition) policy but we don't have a similar policy for EVM?
- Discussed the Air Force draft Technical Data parameters.
 - Questioned if CADE has the ability to issue RFP'S with the 1921-T DID; (i.e. an updated/revised DD 2794 process/tool)
- Question: Will the FlexFile be required with the RFP/proposal?
 - 1921 and 1921-1 currently required via the CSDR DFARS clauses
