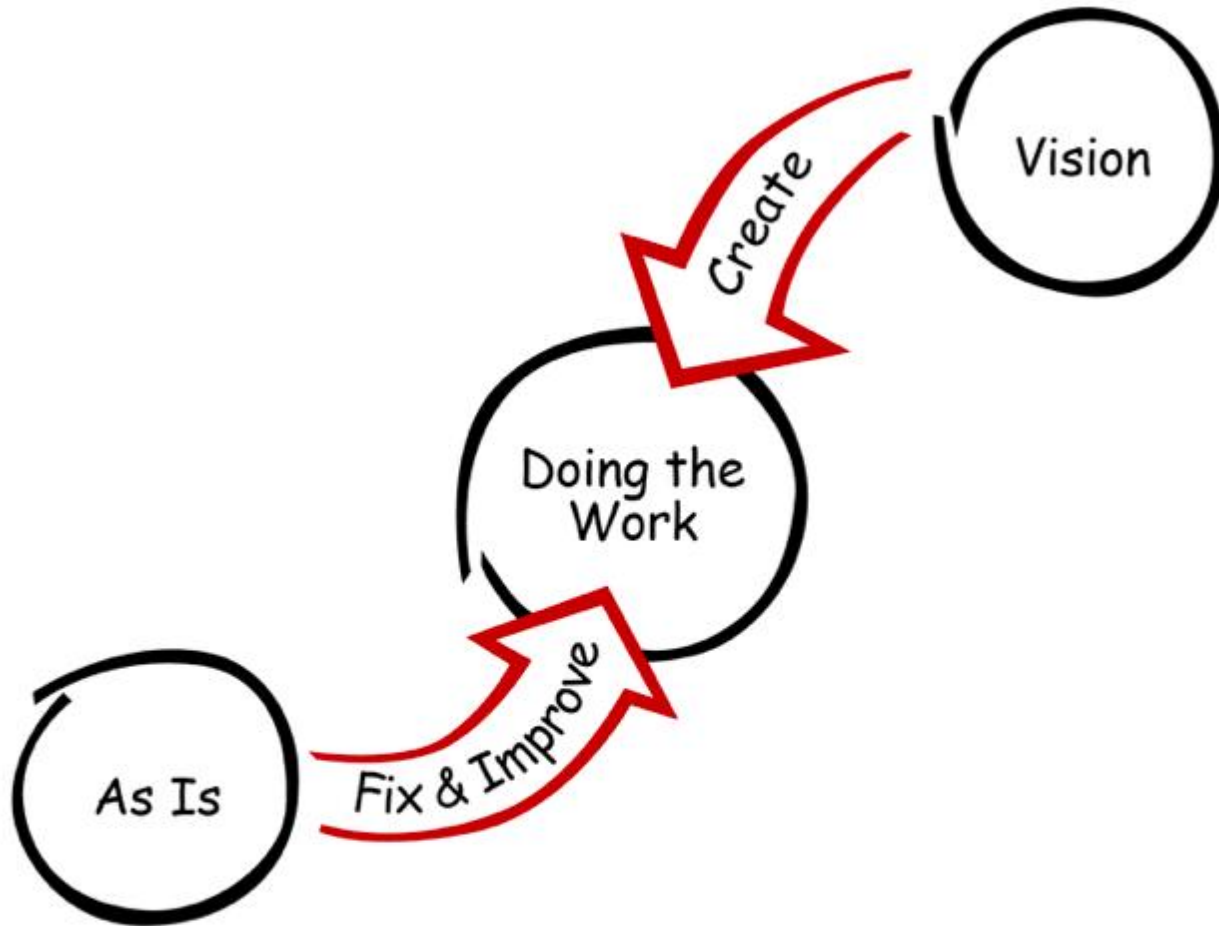

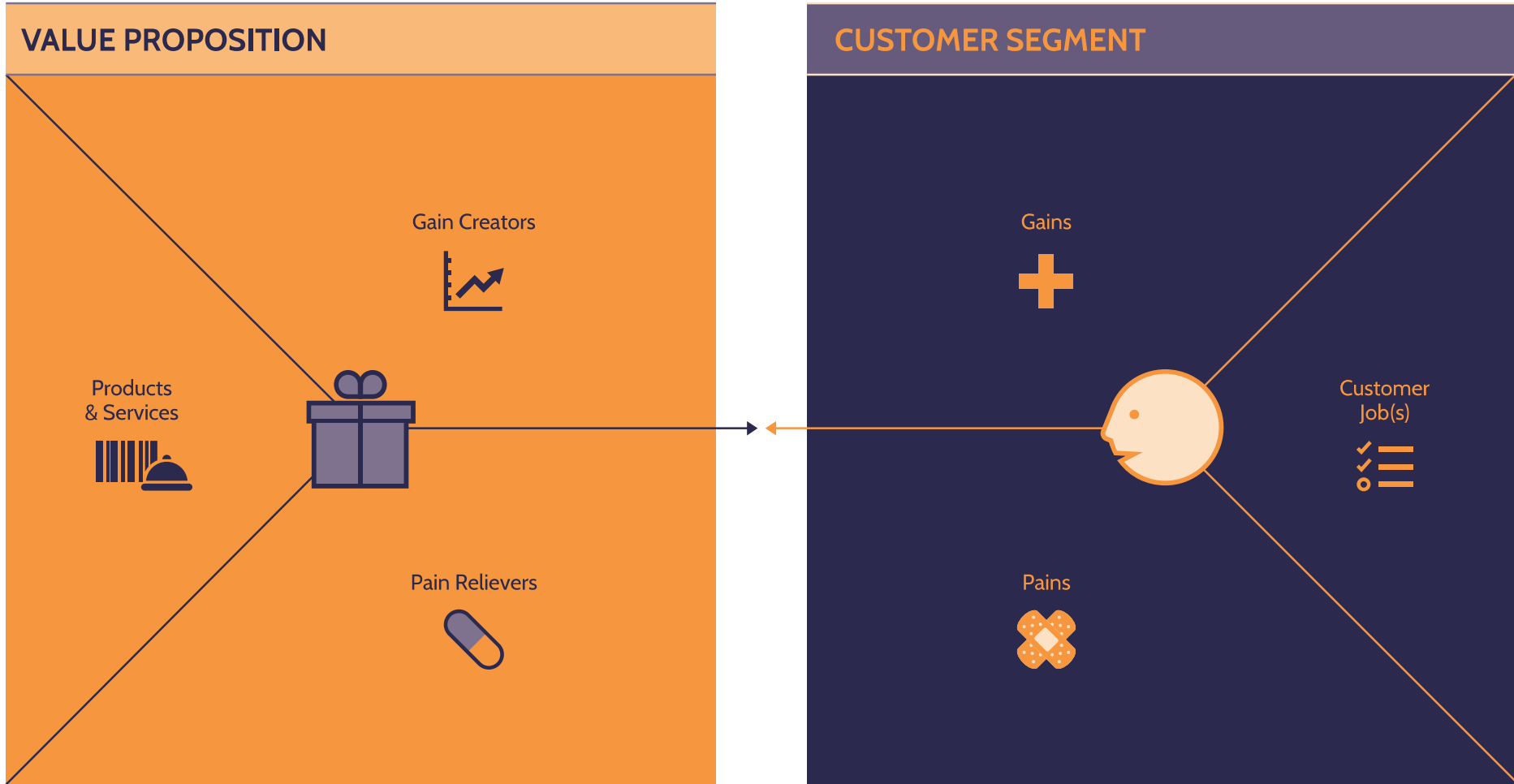

MINIMUM VIABLE PRODUCT (MVP) DEVELOPMENT METHOD

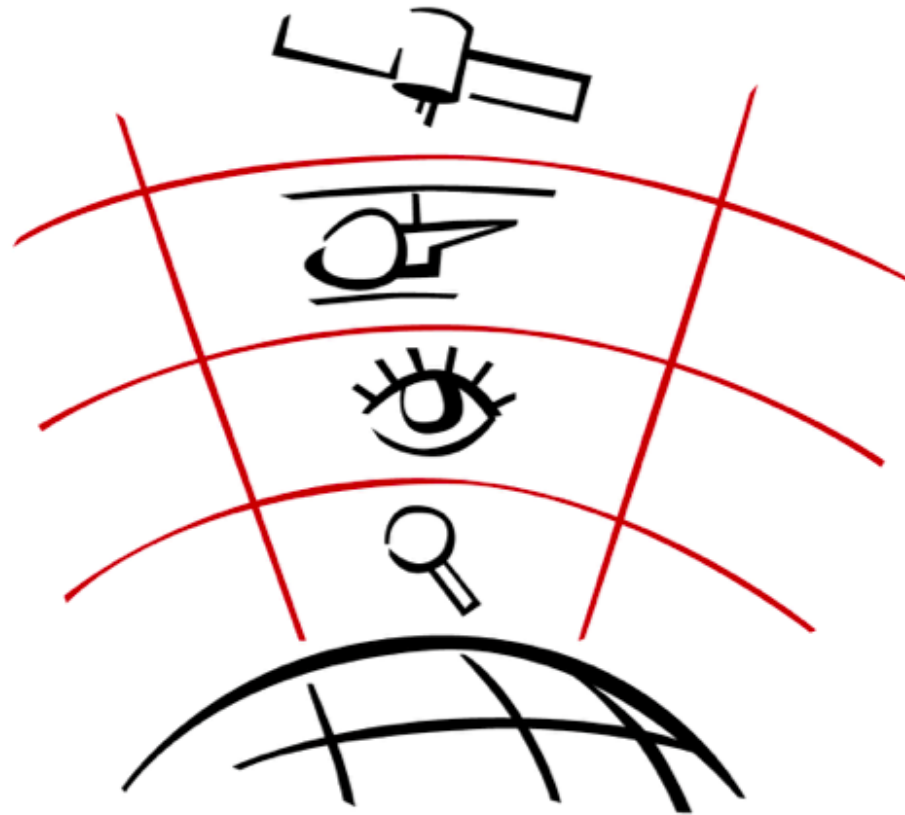
Traditional Development Method

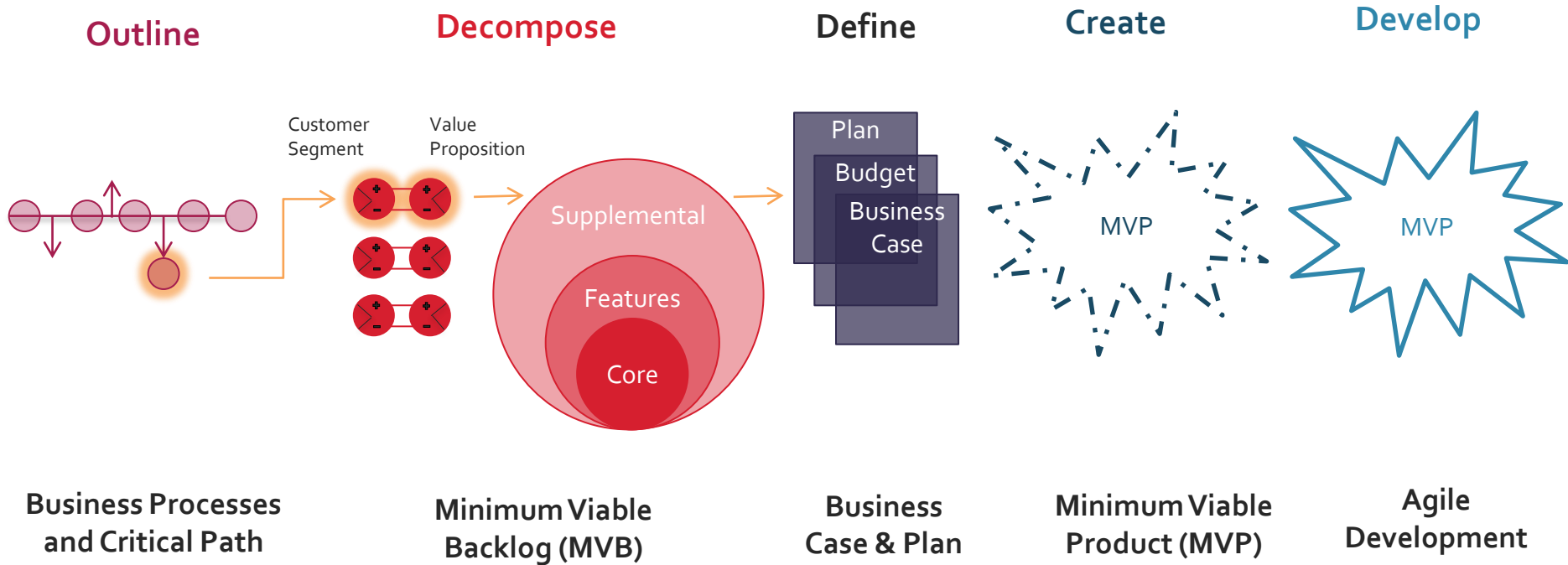

3 things to get started

- ✓ Product Owner dedicated to the team full time
- ✓ MVP create the simplest path to the end
- ✓ Plausible start

3 things to navigate

- ✓ Measure progress
- ✓ Budget
- ✓ Overall cost

LESSONS LEARNED

- 1 It won't be perfect
- 2 Agile process = people see pulling things out gets the product sooner
- 3 Work hardest at earning trust
- 4 Business prioritization process with agile is seamless
- 5 Productivity gain through continuous improvement
- 6 Fear of the unknown inhibits the move to agile
