Solution

- Align Federal Software Development Contracts with...
- Agile Software Delivery Methodology
- Team Structure







But How?

- Ask not how much it will cost...
- Ask instead, how much do we invest to achieve value!





Three Variables

- 1. Budget
- 2. Time

3. Scope








Waterfall vs Agile

Adherence to Plan vs Delivery of Maximum Value



Fix Time

PUT THE NAME OF YOUR COMPANY HERE

- Based on "real" delivery deadline
- Deliver all of the features
- And if all features cannot be delivered, then deliver a sub-set





Framing a Fixed Time Contract

Write the contract to have a fixed length with language like this

- The engagement will begin on October 1, 2014 and will end on January 1, 2015.
- The hourly rate will be \$X/hr.
- Based on the hourly rate of \$X, and the estimate discussed, the total

engagement is estimated to cost approximately \$XXX.





Fix Budget

- Based on max funding available
- Build and deliver until \$ = 0 ;-(





Framing a Fixed Budget Contract

Write a fixed budget contract with language like this

- The engagement will begin at a mutually agreed upon date on or around XXX.
- The hourly rate will be \$X/hr.
- Based on the hourly rate of \$X, and the estimate discussed, the total engagement is estimated to cost approximately \$XXX.
- The budget for this Engagement will not exceed \$200,000 (the



"Term").



Fix Scope

• First, congratulate yourself!

– You are in very rare company, truly.

• You have deep pockets and luxury of time on your side, go for it 0;-)





Framing a Fixed Scope Contract

Write the contract to have a fixed scope with language like this

- The engagement will begin at a mutually agreed upon date on or around XXX.
- The hourly rate will be \$X/hr.
- Based on the hourly rate of \$X, and the estimate discussed, the total engagement is estimated to cost approximately \$XXX.
- The agreed upon features for this engagement are: XXXX





Framing a Fixed Scope Contract

ALERT!

Ensure stakeholders understand that both time and cost can

increase in order to ensure the agreed upon features are

delivered.





Recommend – Fixed Time and Fixed Budget Contract

Hire an (Agile) Scrum Team

- Fix the number of Iterations (Sprint)
 - And fix the duration of each Iteration (Sprint)
- Fix the size of Scrum Team
 - Example:
 - TIME: 10 Sprints x 2 weeks/Sprint = <u>20 weeks</u>
 - **COST:** Blended labor rate of \$125/hr x 10 FTEs x 20 weeks = **<u>\$1000,000</u>**
- Now it is easy to know the **duration** and **cost** for the project





How to Fix Scope?

- But what about the scope (features) you ask?
- Define SOE, Product Vision and High-Level Features
 Include in RFP:
 - SOE
 - Product Vision
 - (Desired) Product Roadmap
 - (Desired) MVP
 - Initial Product Backlog
 - High level Features & Sub-features





Recommendations

Design Your Agile Contract for Success & Avoid Common Mistakes

- Use Statement of Objectives (aligned with Product Vision)
 - Instead of SOW implies requirements are well defined/known and all of them need to be developed
- Fix Budget
 - Rather than use FFP or T&M pricing provides weak controls; opens the door to "scope creep"
- Explicitly define "Success" or "Acceptance"
 - Lack of explicit success criteria
