

The Results



- Financial Summary:
 - + \$ 578 Registration income
 - + \$3,160 Sponsorship income
 - \$2,385 Catering
 - + \$1,353 NET proceeds
- Registration (two sites)/Attendance: 70 (90 Registered)
 - 50% students, 43% industry, 7% academia
 - 45% of non-students were WID members
- WID-GBC website newsletter: subscription increase 10%
- New sponsors: General Dynamics, SENEDIA, JRAD
- Mentor/Mentee relationships: Over a dozen being developed
- WID-GBC Member Registration: Up 8% and new regional impact area
- First WID-GBC scholarship: \$1,000
