Strategy and Policy – Regulatory Policy Efforts

- AT THE HEART OF THE MISSION NDIR
- Engaged on multiple rule-making efforts through presentations, comments, and interviews to include:
 - Accelerated implementation of the Runway Extension Act (5yr vice 3yr lookback to determine small business)
 - Suspended DoD rewrite of Progress Payment rules
 - DoD now doing a contract financing study before proposing any further rule modifications
 - Effectively restricted LPTA as a contract vehicle
 - The FY 2017 NDAA included language to restrict the use of LPTAs NDIA supported this provision
 - Communicated negative impacts of LPTAs to DoD officials thru tri-association meetings, etc.
 - Inputs incorporated in two final rules (one FAR, one DFARS) recently published implementing the FY 2017 NDAA provisions that further limit LPTAs
 - New regulations require contracting officers to seek out and receive permission prior to using an LPTA source selection and narrowly outlines the situations where permission to use LPTA will be granted
- Published Cybersecurity white paper with comprehensive DIB survey of current state-of-the-industry
- Developed an Amicus process with formal request available online and an Amicus Fund where members can contribute
 - Amicus Briefs cost \$15K-\$25K, members can offset that cost while through contributions to the fund without tying their name to any singular brief
- Established NDIA as DoD go-to association for policy
 - Non-Program of Record, CMMC, Army IP Policy, Army Advanced Manufacturing Policy, A&S Small Business Strategy, GAO listening sessions, Navy Small Business Survey, etc.
