The Objectives

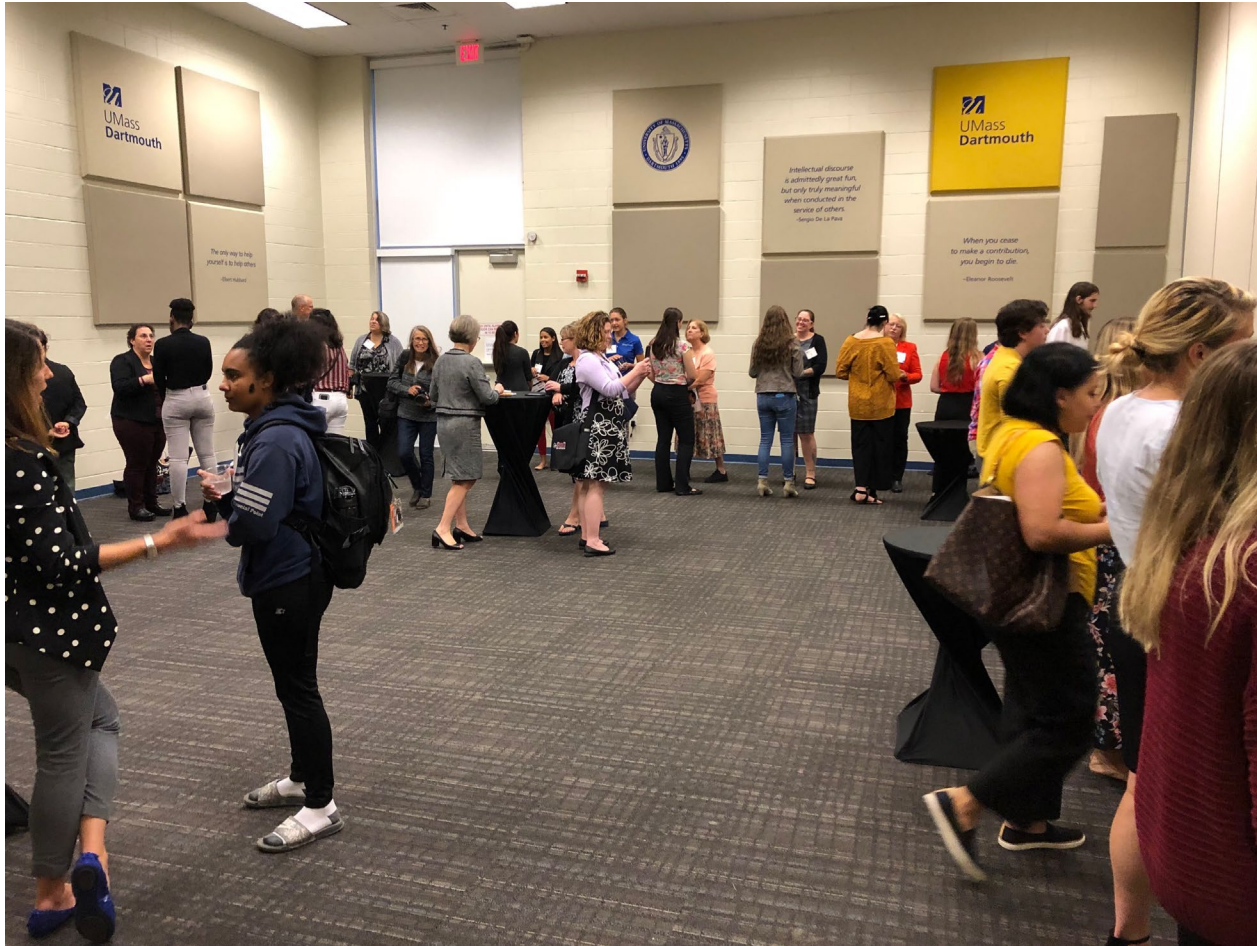
- **Create an event to establish a dialogue between National Defense professionals and College of Engineering female students to capture their interests and encourage their continued engineering education**

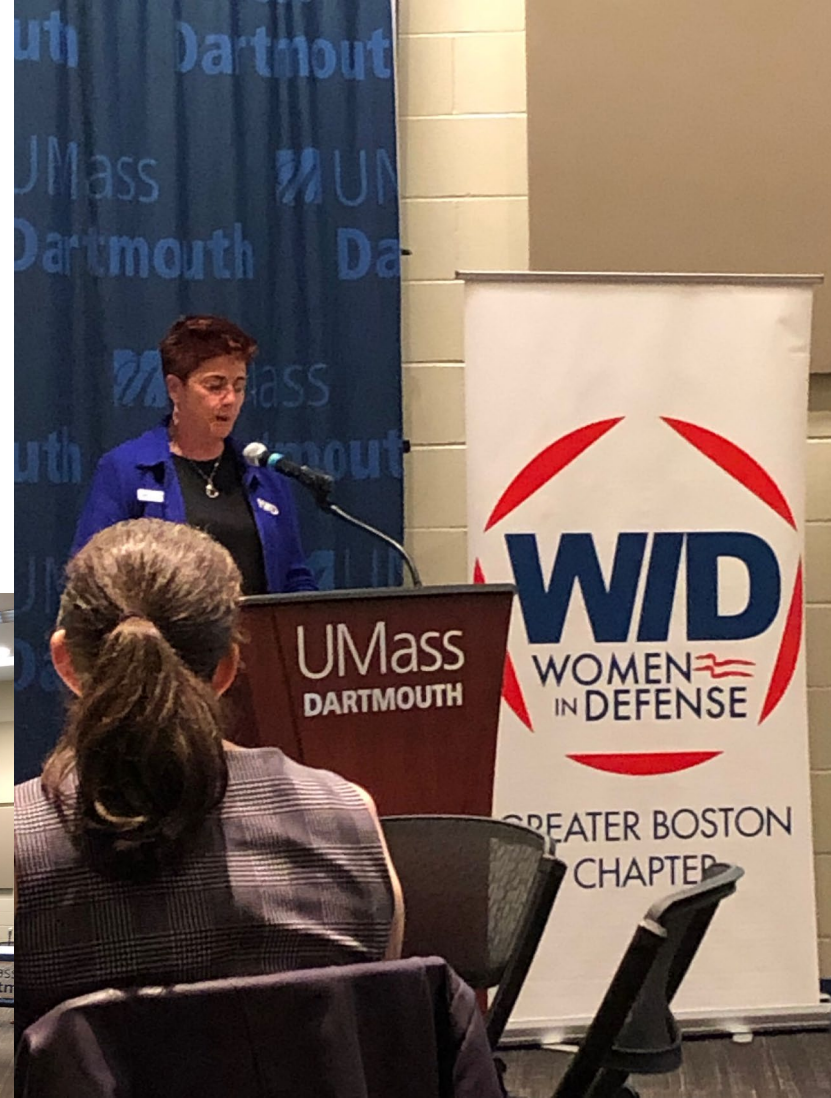

The Results

- **Financial Summary:**
 - + \$ 578 Registration income
 - + \$3,160 Sponsorship income
 - \$2,385 Catering
 - + \$1,353 NET proceeds
- **Registration (two sites)/Attendance: 70 (90 Registered)**
 - 50% students, 43% industry, 7% academia
 - 45% of non-students were WID members
- **WID-GBC website newsletter:** subscription increase 10%
- **New sponsors:** General Dynamics, SENEDIA, JRAD
- **Mentor/Mentee relationships:** Over a dozen being developed
- **WID-GBC Member Registration:** Up 8% and new regional impact area
- **First WID-GBC scholarship:** \$1,000
