


San Diego Site Map



















Driving Directions

From Los Angeles and Points North Heading South

- Take I-405 (San Diego Freeway) or I-5 (Santa Ana Freeway South) (both freeways turn into I-5 South).
- Take CA-78 East past Camp Pendleton and Oceanside (Vista Way exit East and merge onto CA-78 East toward Escondido/Vista/San Marcos.
- Take I-15 South towards San Diego.

... to Building 1 or 2

- (see From Los Angeles... above).
- ... I-15 South towards San Diego.
- Take Rancho Bernardo Road exit West (right).
- Turn left on Camino San Bernardo.
- Turn right on Coastwood Road.
- Turn right on Goldentop Road.

... to Building 3

- (see From Los Angeles... above).
- 🚗 ... I-15 South towards San Diego.
- Take Rancho Bernardo Road exit West (right).
- Turn left on Via Del Campo.
- Turn left on Via Del Campo Court at the stop sign.
- Proceed up the hill to the guard station.
- Inform guard that you are here to visit Northrop Grumman.
- Take an immediate right turn and proceed through the parking lot to Northrop Grumman Building 3.

... to Building 6 or 6A

- (see From Los Angeles... above).
- ... I-15 South towards San Diego.
- Take Rancho Bernardo Road exit West (right).
- Turn left on Via Del Campo.
- Turn right on Via Del Campo Court.
- Building 6 or 6A are at the end of the cul de sac.

... to Building 7

- (see From Los Angeles... above).
- ... I-15 South towards San Diego.
- Take the Rancho Bernardo Road exit West (right).
- Take the first left onto W Bernardo Drive.
- Building 7 is on the left.

... to Building 8 or 8A

- (see From Los Angeles... above).
- ... I-15 South towards San Diego.
- Take the Rancho Bernardo Road exit West (right).
- Take the first left onto W Bernardo Drive.
- Bldg 8 or 8A is on the right, note that building 8 has a sign that read Bldg 2 and building 8A has a sign that read Bldg 1.

From San Diego International Airport Heading North

- Upon leaving the airport, go east on North Harbor Drive.
- Turn left onto West Laurel Street and continue up the hill to 6th Avenue.
- Turn left onto 6th Avenue.
- Merge onto CA-163 North toward Escondido (CA-163 North eventually becomes I-15 North).
- Merge onto I-15 North.

... to Building 1 or 2

- (see From San Diego international Airport... above).
- ... onto I-15 North.
- Take the Camino Del Norte exit West.
- Turn right on Camino San Bernardo.
- Turn left on Coastwood Road.
- Turn right on Goldentop Road.

... to Building 3

- (see From San Diego international Airport... above).
- e ... onto I-15 North.
- Take the Rancho Bernardo Road exit West (left).
- Turn left on Via Del Campo.
- Turn left on Via Del Campo Court at the stop sign.
- Proceed up the hill to the guard station.
- Inform guard that you are here to visit Northrop Grumman.
- Take an immediate right turn and proceed through the parking lot to Northrop Grumman Building 3.

... to Building 6 or 6A

- (see From San Diego international Airport... above).
- ... onto I-15 North.
- Take the Rancho Bernardo Road exit West (left).
- Turn left on Via Del Campo.
- Turn right on Via Del Campo Court.
- Bldg 6 or 6A are at the end of the cul de sac.


... to Building 7


- (see From San Diego international Airport... above).

- Take the Rancho Bernardo Road exit West (left).
- Turn left on W Bernardo Drive.
- Bldg 8 or 8A is on the right, note that building 8 has a sign that read Bldg 2 and building 8A has a sign that read Bldg 1.


San Diego International Airport Maps
