- Establishing NDIA Business Institute to diversify revenues and provide members with courses and certifications to do business with DoD
- Finalizing the NDIA Emerging Technologies Institute (ETI)
- Executing USD A&S Working group on Spectrum sharing
- Leading the Cross-departmental Working Group (CDWG)
 - Developed FY21 Strategic POAM
 - Reforming meetings to remove redundancy and drive information cross-flow and collaboration
 - Will tackle internal processes

- Sharing of SCIFs across government departments




Vital Signs 2021

Our Methodology



- We assessed eight business environment and performance conditions to assess the health of the defense industrial base
- Overall, we scored 55 longitudinal statistical indicators on a scale of 0 to 100
- Scores are determined by comparing 3-year averages to a baseline peak figure
- Like a GPA, we averaged indicator scores together
- Research assistance from NDIA's Junior Fellows



Key Takeaway: Total Obligations








Combined, Professional Services and IT spending outpaced Ships/Aircraft and Land Vehicles

Key Takeaway: Survey and COVID-19



- Survey fielded in August 2020 and sent to NDIA members
- 52% of respondents thought that it would take six months or longer for their business to return to normal (n= 1118)
- 12% did not believe that their business would return to normal levels of operations compared to one year ago (n= 1118)
- 71% thought COVID-19 <u>had a Moderate or Large Negative effect</u> on their business (n= 1118)
