The NDIA has a policy of strict compliance with federal and state antitrust laws. The antitrust laws prohibit competitors from engaging in actions that could result in an unreasonable restraint of trade. Consequently, NDIA members must avoid discussing certain topics when they are together at formal association membership, board, committee, and other meetings and in informal contacts with other industry members: prices, fees, rates, profit margins, or other terms or conditions of sale (including allowances, credit terms, and warranties); allocation of markets or customers or division of territories; or refusals to deal with or boycotts of suppliers, customers or other third parties, or topics that may lead participants not to deal with a particular supplier, customer or third party.

Keynote Speaker Biographies



John P. Dixon

Director for Defense Intelligence for Counterintelligence, Law Enforcement & Security, OUSD (I&S)

John Dixon is the Director for Defense Intelligence (Counterintelligence, Law Enforcement

and Security) (CL&S), Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence and Security (OUSD(I&S)). In this role, he is responsible for developing policy, overseeing policy implementation, and aligning resources and authorities for counterintelligence (CI), law enforcement, and security programs, operations, and activities across the Department.

Dixon began his career on active duty in the U.S. Army in 1982, serving in multiple

CI tactical, strategic and special operations assignments across the United States, Asia and the Middle East (DESERT SHIELD/STORM). Following his retirement from active duty in 2002, Dixon began his civilian service career in multiple CI positions, and as the Senior Intelligence Oversight Inspector in the U.S. Army Inspector General Agency, Pentagon. In 2007, he returned to the Middle East and served as the Director of the Strategic CI Directorate-Iraq (SCID-I), Baghdad, during Operation IRAQI FREEDOM. In 2008, Dixon joined the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) where created and led the first DoD-level offensive CI operations capability, and later became DIA's Chief of

the Office of CI, responsible for directing the full spectrum of CI activities. In 2020, as the DIA Deputy Chief of Staff, Dixon was responsible for guiding agency strategy, staff operations, policy development, and corporate communications. In 2021, Dixon was appointed as DIA's Director for Security where he was responsible for protecting agency people, property, information, and operations.

Dixon's awards include the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Civilian Service Award, Superior Civilian Service Awards, the DoD CI Award (Special), and the DoD CI Award (Countering Covert and Clandestine Threats).



Michael Casey

Director, NCSC

On September 18, 2023, Michael C. Casey was sworn in as the Director of the National

Counterintelligence and Security Center (NCSC). In this role, he leads and supports the counterintelligence (CI) and security activities of the U.S. Government, and serves as the principal CI and security advisor to the Director of National Intelligence

Under Casey's leadership, NCSC produces the National Counterintelligence Strategy of the United States and leads national-level CI and security programs, including the National Insider Threat Task Force, CI mission

management, security clearance policy and reform, supply chain risk mitigation, and security standards and compliance for overseas diplomatic facilities. NCSC also plays a critical role in conducting outreach to the private sector and other stakeholders on foreign intelligence threats and how to mitigate these threats.

Prior to joining NCSC, Casey served as the Staff Director for the U.S. Senate Select Committee on Intelligence (SSCI) since 2016. Working with the Minority Staff Director, he led the staff as they supported Committee Members in conducting oversight of the U.S. Intelligence Community's budget and activities.

Before his service in the U.S. Senate, Casey served as a Professional Staff Member on the House Armed Services Committee for more than nine years. He was responsible for policy covering a broad spectrum of global operations, as well as policies relating to the Department of Defense. In total, he spent over 27 years working for Congress in a variety of positions, most related to national security.

Casey is a graduate of the University of Kentucky and earned a Master of Arts degree from Georgetown University.

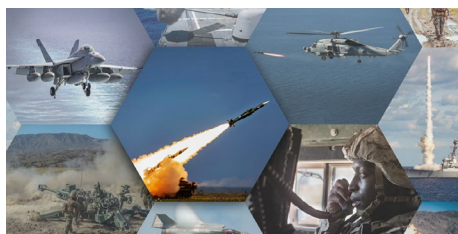
