Reforming Controls on Technology and Services

- Scope of "technical data" covered by ITAR
  - Clarifying whether certain information
- Scope of "defense services" covered by ITAR
- Scope of "derived data" (ITAR) and "direct product" (EAR)

#### **Reforming ITAR Licensing**

- Program licensing for major international defense programs
- Improving license exemptions, particularly for shipments to the U.S. Government
- Proviso reform

#### Partnership and Outreach

- Partnership with industry State's DTAG and Commerce's cross-TAC "working group"
- Outreach to 2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> tier suppliers
- Improved alignment with Justice Department
- Structuring partnership and outreach with allied governments and industry
