Evaluating Export Control Reform

- Major, long-term initiative
- Time is ripe to evaluate now that core List Reform is essentially completed and as a new Administration takes office
- Evaluation should assess impact on national security, partnership with allies, industry
- Potential reviewers – GAO? National Academy of Sciences?

Reforming Controls on Technology and Services

- Scope of “technical data” covered by ITAR
 - Clarifying whether certain information
- Scope of “defense services” covered by ITAR
- Scope of “derived data” (ITAR) and “direct product” (EAR)

Reforming ITAR Licensing

- Program licensing for major international defense programs
- Improving license exemptions, particularly for shipments to the U.S. Government
- Proviso reform

Partnership and Outreach

- Partnership with industry – State’s DTAG and Commerce’s cross-TAC “working group”
- Outreach to 2nd/3rd tier suppliers
- Improved alignment with Justice Department
- Structuring partnership and outreach with allied governments and industry
